Ralph DiLauro’s “Psychadellic Boutique” Group W Bench business thrives after 55 years

Ralph DiLauro was born in West Haven CT, but grew up and worked in New Haven's Hill neighborhood. He attended art school in 1966 at the L.A. Art Center upon leaving the National Guard. DiLauro’s inspiration for opening the Group W Bench stemmed from his time taking in the cultural beauty of 1960s Berkeley California. The business first opened in 1968 on Howard Street, moving later to Edgewood Avenue, then Dwight Street, and finally its current location at 1171 Chapel Street. DiLauro eventually took over an adjacent space on Chapel Street Group W left vacant by a tailor, and later decided to blow out a connecting wall to increase the store's size.



DiLauro aims to buy his stock and store items from local artists and smaller, personally known vendors. Visitors over the years include actress Julia Roberts, Jack White (The White Stripes), and funk musician George Clinton. The business rebounded surpris-
